

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS & SAFETY  
VALPARAISO, INDIANA  
MAY 11, 2006**

The Board of Public Works and Safety met on May 11, 2006, at 10:00 a.m. Present were members John Hardwick and Mayor Jon Costas. Mayor Costas led the Pledge of Allegiance. Minutes of the meeting of April 26, 2006, were approved on motion of John Hardwick, seconded by Mayor Costas and so approved. John Hardwick moved that the claims be approved for payment subject to appropriation balances, seconded by Mayor Costas and so approved.

Salt bids for Public Works were opened. Central Salt and Detroit Salt Company presented bids. Bids will be held for Bill Oeding to review and make a recommendation upon motion of Mayor Costas, seconded by John Hardwick and so approved.

Allie Mitchels, Redevelopment Commission intern, made a presentation and recommendation on the Lincoln Highway Project in regard to signage. John Hardwick moved to approve the signage as requested, seconded by Mayor Costas and so approved.

Tim Burkman, Engineering, presented a recommendation from Traffic & Safety to place a handicapped parking space on College and Union for the Hilltop Clinic. John Hardwick moved to approve the request, seconded by Mayor Costas and so approved.

Mayor Costas advised that Stu Summers left Supplemental Agreement #2 with American Consulting in regard to the roundabout for them to provide environmental documentation and project development for INDOT. John Hardwick moved to approve the agreement, seconded by Mayor Costas and so approved.

Matt Kras asked for approval of the contract with HPP Construction to begin the work on the Campbell Street Project. John Hardwick moved to approve the contract, seconded by Mayor Costas and so approved.

Tim Burkman presented recommendations from the Traffic & Safety Committee to install a streetlight at the intersection of Valparaiso Street and Highland Drive and to install a double yellow centerline along Burlington Beach Road from Calumet Avenue to S.R. 49. John Hardwick moved to approve the recommendations, seconded by Mayor Costas and so approved.
