RESOLUTION NO. 1, 2001

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF VALPARAISO, INDIANA AUHTORIZING A SUBMITTAL OF THE CFF APPLICATION TO THE INDIANA DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND ADDRESSING RELATED MATTERS

WHEREAS, the City of Valparaiso recognizes the need to stimulate growth and to maintain a sound economy within its corporate limits and;

WHEREAS, the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, authorizes the Indiana Department of Commerce to provide grants to units of government to meet the housing and community development needs of low and moderate income persons and;

WHEREAS, the City of Valparaiso has conducted or will conduct public hearings prior to the submission of an application to the Indiana Department of Commerce, said public hearings to assess the housing, public facilities and economic needs of its low and moderate income residents:

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by The Common Council of the City of Valparaiso, that:

- 1. The Mayor is authorized to prepare and submit an application for grant funding to address the continued need for sidewalk and pedestrian improvements in the downtown commercial area, and to execute and administer a resultant grant including requisite general administration and project management, contracts and agreements pursuant to regulations of the Indiana Department of Commerce and the United States Department of Housing And Urban Development.
- 2. The City of Valparaiso hereby commits the requisite local funds in the amount of four hundred and thirty eight thousand dollars (\$438,000.00).
